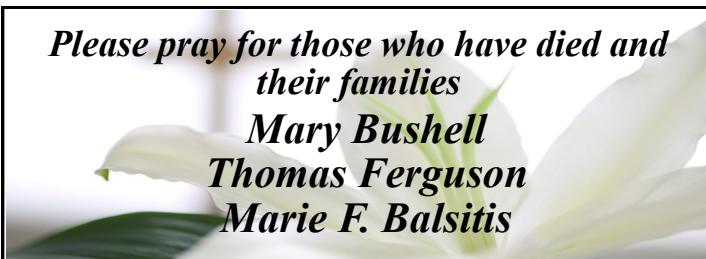

From the Pastor's Desk...

The readings on this Sunday speak to the challenges, the possible sacrifices, and the attitudes needed to follow Christ as His disciple. Each of us through Baptism is called to be the Lord's Disciple, and many of us intellectually understand that. However, making the commitment necessary to fulfill that goal can be difficult in today's world.

"No one who sets a hand to the plow, and looks to what was left behind is fit for the Kingdom of God." Jesus was fond of using agricultural terms and images when teaching His Apostles and His followers, and this quote, which comes at the end of our Gospel Reading from Luke today, is an excellent example of that.

In fact, you almost have to have had experience with farming and plowing to understand what it means. It is essential for the health and sustenance of crops that the furrows made by a plow, and in which the seeds will be planted, are straight. Whether plowing in Jesus' time either by hand or with a plow pulled by oxen, to plow straight rows, someone had to focus on where he was going, not on where he had been. It has not changed with our modern farm equipment today.

In other words, the secret is to look forward and to assure that you are going in a straight line. Looking back invariably makes the person plowing lose focus. That is Jesus' point to us. As good stewards, we must keep our focus on Him, on following Him, and on being His disciple. That allows us to move toward our goal of holiness and of being the kind of disciple He wants us to be.

Respect Life Abortion Survivors

Child psychiatrist Philip Ney relates, "A woman reported telling her nine year old son about her abortion, which had taken place years before he was born. He said, 'I knew, Mom, that there was something wrong. I always have nightmares about knives and my mother killing me. I have an imaginary brother who wants to kill me. If you had not aborted the other, would you have aborted me?'" (Abortion Survivors, p.36).

This is a story repeated more times than most people realize, and representing a societal and pastoral problem whose proportions are greater today than at any previous time in history: the phenomenon of tens of millions of abortion survivors.

It is clear that abortion's primary victim is the child who is killed. It has also become increasingly clear that to kill the child is to harm the mother and father as well. What is not always so well known, however, is that abortion makes its impact felt on those who have had a sibling aborted and that this impact is felt in surprising and astonishing ways, which also have wider implications for the whole of society.

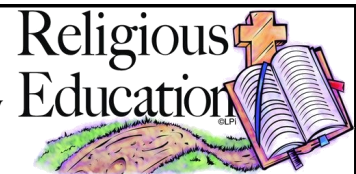
We will also have with us a First Class Relic of Blessed Mother Teresa.

PILGRIMAGE to MEXICO December 5-13, 2016
CELEBRATION of the Virgin of GUADALUPE
St. FRANCIS BORGIA PARISH & Lotus Travel World, Inc

Day 1. DECEMBER 5 – Monday CHICAGO -MEXICO CITY - Morning flight to Mexico City. Upon arrival, you will be greeted by your guide. Lunch and tour of the City include City Center, Main Square-Zocalo, the Cathedral and National Palace from the outside, visit the Basilica of Guadalupe, Mass. Overnight in Mexico City. (Lunch, Dinner)

Day 2. DECEMBER 6 -Tuesday MEXICO CITY –ANTHROPOLOGY MUSEUM –TEOTIHUACAN - After breakfast, a continued tour of Mexico City, Museum of Anthropology. After lunch, we will visit Teotihuacan, which means "Place where gods are born" the archeological site with the famous Moon and Sun Pyramids, Temples, palaces built originally by the Toltec Civilization and then inhabited by the Aztecs. Here also you will shop for souvenirs, and after return to Mexico City where we will have dinner. Night in Mexico City.(Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner)

Day 3. DECEMBER 7-Wednesday MEXICO CITY-TAXCO - After breakfast, we will depart to Taxco – Silver Town, situated at the altitude of 1800 m. -5000 feet above sea level. That was once a silver mining town, now best known for its silver craft. Taxco is a treasure trove of valuable historical, colonial architecture from the sixteenth to the nineteenth century. We will have Mass in Cathedral - El Templo Santa Prisca, which dominates Plaza Borda. Night in Taxco (B.L.D)

Day 4. DECEMBER 8-Thursday TAXCO-ACAPULCO - After breakfast, we will depart to Acapulco for about a four hr. drive. Here we will spend a restful afternoon at an ALL-inclusive resort located on the beach of the Pacific Ocean/ Acapulco Bay. At night, we will take you to La Quebrada, where divers plunge off cliffs some 130 feet high into a cove that is only safe to dive in when the wave comes in. A City tour at night by bus. (B.L. Dinner –all you can eat & drink)

Day 5. DECEMBER 9-Friday DAY in ACAPULCO - A daytime tour of Acapulco- Pearl of Pacific – World Famous Resort in 1970's and 80's. The rest of the day you can relax at our All -Inclusive resort. At sunset, you can enjoy a cruise on Acapulco Bay. (B,L. D-all inclusive)

Day 7. DECEMBER 11-Sunday MEXICO CITY- PUEBLA-ANGEL CITY - In the morning after breakfast, we will drive to Puebla for full day tour of Blessed John Paul II's favorite town, where he stayed during his first visit to Mexico in 1979. Walking tour of Puebla: Cathedral from the 17th century, St. Dominic's Church with a gold-covered chapel of Our Lady of Holy Rosary with Holy Mass at the church. Next, we take a walk down the "Sweet Street" to the El Parian market, where we can buy plenty of tasty treats and crafts from the region. On the way back to Mexico City, you will see many pilgrims walking, biking, driving to the Basilica. It is impressive to see them on the road strengthened by so much faith. Farewell Dinner with Mariachis and overnight. (B,L,D)

Day 8. DECEMBER 12-Monday CELEBRATION OF THE VIRGIN OF GUADALUPE in Mexico City
"The Day of the Virgin Mary of Guadalupe" Mexico's Patron Saint, is a famous Catholic feast that celebrates the belief that a man encountered the Virgin Mary on December 12, 1531. Catholics from across Mexico and other countries pay pilgrimage to see an image of Mary (Virgin Morena), believed to be authentic, in the Basilica of Guadalupe in Mexico City. Children are dressed in traditional costumes and are blessed in church. Thousands of people come to the Basilica to pray. We will assist at all these celebrations and will have time to pray and enjoy this very important day. Lunch on your own. Time for shopping. Dinner in a restaurant. Then transfer to the airport. Overnight Flight back to Chicago.(B)
